PAMELA MOLINA PRESENTS AGROLÍBANO'S SUSTAINABILITY STRATEGY

Pamela Molina shared Agrolibano's sustainability strategy with 46 participants, emphasizing environmental and social programs, particularly those aimed at reducing multidimensional poverty in communities of influence and also within the company. These programs are assessed using community multidimensional poverty index.

CLOSING OF THE TERRITORIAL WATER GOVERNANCE PROGRAM

The closure of the Territorial Water Governance Program in Region 13 of the Gulf of Fonseca was conducted, supported by Swiss Cooperation. Over 7 years, local stakeholders, private companies, public institutions, and communities worked together on water resource management. Agrolibano, through its Foundation and the anti-drought committee, played a prominent role, sharing experiences and harvesting programs initiated 15 years ago. To sustain this process, Agrolibano recommends educational programs in schools and that municipal governments allocate 10% of their budget to watershed protection and responsible water resource management.



53 CLASSROOMS RECEIVE TEXTBOOKS AND LEARNING MATERIALS

The Comprehensive Support Program for the Development of Children and Adolescents in the School Environment (ADINAE) has delivered teaching materials to 53 classrooms in the first cycle to enhance the competencies of students from first to third grade. With financial support from Tesco, textbooks in Spanish and Mathematics have been distributed to 830 primary school girls and boys, contributing to SDGs 4 and 17.
