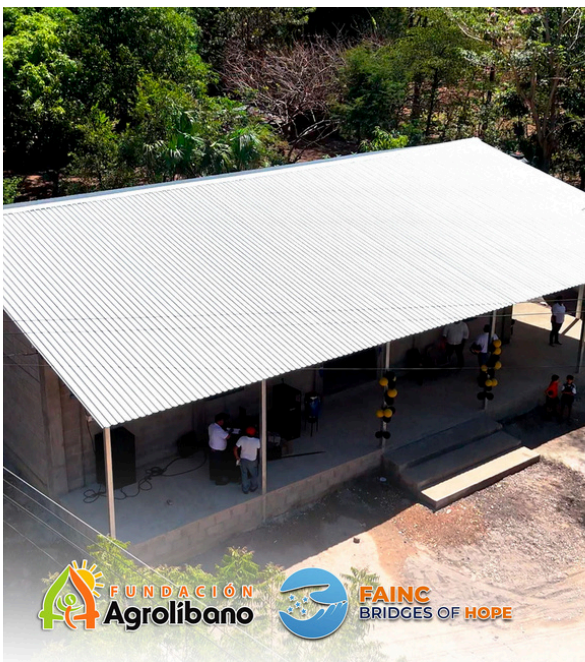


STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS DRIVING COMMUNITY WELL-BEING

From February 3rd to 6th, Fundación Agrolíbano hosted Fundación Amigos de Bernabé, marking the beginning of a collaboration to strengthen Health, Education, and Living Standards programs in vulnerable communities in southern Honduras.

During the visit, local leaders from San Agustín, Agua Agría #2, Altos del Estiquirín, and Espino shared their commitment to regional development. A meeting was also held with the Hospital del Sur to align efforts with the 'Healthy Children,' 'Healthy Communities,' and 'Healthy Honduras' programs, in line with SDGs #3, 4, 5, 6, 13, 15, and 17.

This joint effort reaffirms that through strategic partnerships, we can move toward a healthier, more sustainable, and poverty-free future.



INAUGURATION OF THE MULTI-PURPOSE CENTER IN THE COMMUNITY OF AGUA AGRÍA NO. 2

On Saturday, February 15th, the community of Agua Agría No. 2 celebrated the inauguration of its new Multi-Purpose Center, a key space to strengthen community unity and improve the quality of life for its residents.

Thanks to the partnership and contributions from the Municipal Mayor's Office of El Corpus, the Mambocauce Municipal Association, Fundación Agrolíbano Inc., Bridges of Hope, local leaders, and the community's families, this center will provide a venue for educational, recreational, and social activities, with a hydro-sanitary module offering a safe and functional environment for all. Representatives from the organizations, local leaders, and community families participated in this meaningful event.

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IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANT NURSERIES IN 5 COMMUNITIES

On February 17, 2025, Fundación Agrolíbano, through its Liderazgo Consciente program, launched the creation of plant nurseries in five communities: Laurelada and Agua Agría #2 in El Corpus, San Agustín in Namasigüe, Tamarindo in Apacilagua, and Altos del Estiquirín in Nacaome. The goal is to promote reforestation and environmental conservation by restoring local ecosystems through the production of seedlings from native species. A total of 115 people, including 70 women and 45 men, are being trained in techniques for substrate preparation and seed management. The initiative strengthens community organization, fosters leadership, and supports the SDGs #13, #15, and #17.



STRENGTHENING FOOD SECURITY AND EDUCATION THROUGH SCHOOL GARDENS

On February 21, 2025, Fundación Agrolíbano began a process of monitoring and technical assistance in the school gardens established in five educational centers, with greenhouse structures provided by the National Rural and Urban Sustainable Development Program (PRONADERS). This action is part of the "Together for Education" initiative, aimed at strengthening food security and providing practical education in sustainable cultivation.

The support includes proper soil preparation, seedling production, fertilizer application, and preventive measures against pests and diseases. Additionally, active participation from teachers, students, and parents has been encouraged. This initiative reaffirms the commitment to sustainability and community development, contributing to the achievement of SDGs #4, #12, and #17, particularly in responsible production and consumption and food security.
